The nation's only award that recognizes the dual role chambers of commerce have leading businesses and communities. The award recognizes excellence in operations, member services and community leadership.

The award recognizes excellence in operations, member services and community leadership.

The Chamber of the Year award involves a multi-stage process, which includes Dynamic Chamber Benchmarking, application and interview. During the first two stages, chambers compete against the numbers. As finalists, they compete against other chambers within their category. ACCE uses a five-factor equation based on the numbers submitted in Dynamic Chamber Benchmarking to determine an applicant's competition category (1–4). This process ensures that all applicants will be competing against chambers of commerce of similar size and capacity.

The benefits of winning Chamber of the Year are significant and going through the process is a great learning experience. Georgia is currently represented by two previous winners, the **Georgia Chamber** and the **Newnan-Coweta Chamber**. But we want more! Everyone is encouraged to participate in the process.
